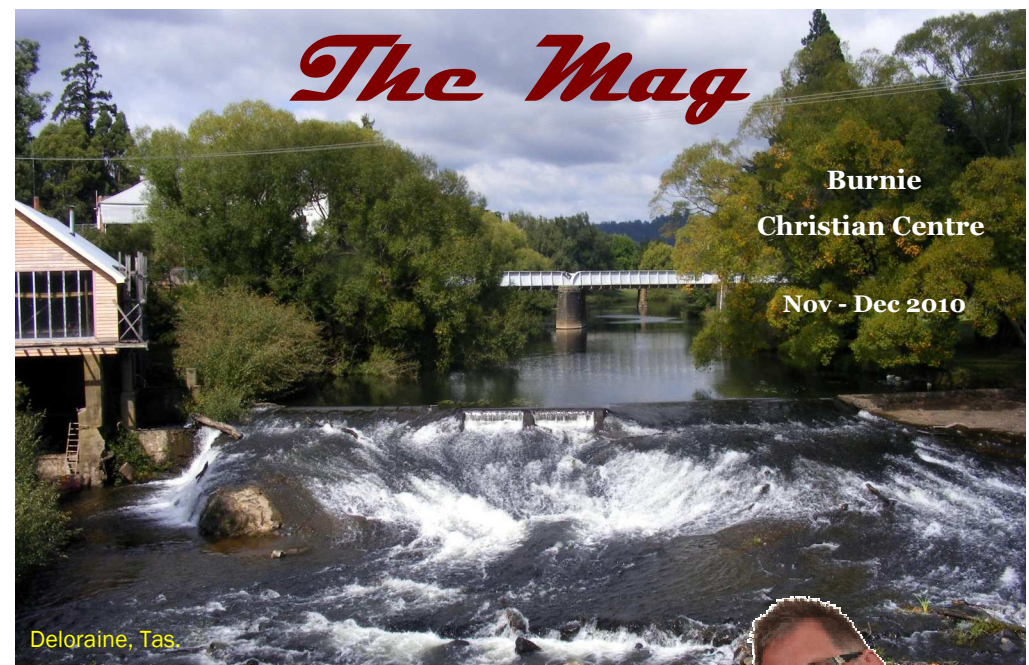

In a very stirring talk on Sunday, October 17, Ps Ian Green of UK gave some disturbing statistics of poverty on the planet. In particular he was referring to the situation in Eastern Europe. Did you know that about 1.7 billion people live in absolute poverty and that some 25,000 people die every day of hunger or hunger-related causes, according to the United Nations? This is one person every three and a half seconds. Unfortunately, it is children who die most often.

We are brokers of hope! Jesus is the broker of hope to the poor. Ian went on to explain five dimensions of poverty -

1. Morally poor - it effects those who do not live with an understanding of the world's view of a system of absolutes - there is very little black and white.
2. Relationally poor - we focus on ourselves to the expense of the community of which we are a part.
3. Motivationally poor - the state of hopelessness that engulf those who have no ways or means of confidence to tackle life's challenges.
4. Materially poor - those who lack the basic necessities to sustain themselves.
5. Spiritually poor - most of the world is so spiritually poor - particularly Europe.

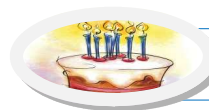

## Explosive Growth of Christianity is Changing China

Communist rulers in China have radically altered their views about religion and as a result, Christianity is growing in China as never before. The caveat is that the closely limited new freedoms are only granted to those Christians willing to worship in government-sanctioned churches. The director general of the State Administration for Religious Affairs, Wang Zuo An, was quoted as saying there are now at least 20 million Christians in China worshipping in the state-sanctioned church.

"Such growth is unprecedented in the history of Christianity in China. Christianity is enjoying its best period of growth in China," he said, adding that, "On the question of whether there is God, the Chinese Communist Party believes there is no God in the world." Rev. John Zhang, a Catholic priest, said: "Some officials say, 'You have done for Chinese society what we cannot do. Without any political involvement, the Church is doing a good job, and we from government appreciate it.'"

The report noted that house – or underground – churches remain a "significant part of the Chinese Christian landscape," but "both the Catholic and Protestant churches sanctioned by the state are now also seeing levels of growth that few predicted in the 1980s." Said one young Chinese Christian student, "I think this nation will change, and I think God is doing great things in China."

## Chilean Miners Prove To Be Faithful Men of God.



The following report is from the CBN News Spanish site, Mundo Cristiano:

The unedited rescue of 33 miners, trapped for more than two months 2,000 feet underground, proceeded smoothly and successfully, as one man after another emerged from the tunnel's interior to regain his freedom and finally see the light of the sun again.

The majority of those rescued have given evidence of deep spirituality and faith in God. They have all agreed that it was their faith that kept them safe and sound during those 69 days in the depths of the earth.

Each of the miners emerged from the capsule named "Fenix" wearing a shirt that said, "Thank you Lord." On the back are the words, "To Him be the glory and honour," taken from Psalm 95:4. "Because in his hands are the depths of the earth, and the heights of the mountains are His."

The shirts were donated by the brother of miner Jose Henriquez, who is an evangelical Christian and has been a spiritual guide for the group. The idea for the shirts came to Henriquez's brother, also a Christian, after hearing a sermon from his pastor on Psalm 95.

Mario Sepúlveda, the second worker to be rescued and the one who gained

the admiration of the world for his good attitude when he came out of the mine, was the first to speak to the press.

"God and the devil were fighting over me and God won", he said. " I always knew they would get me out. I always had faith in the professionals here in Chile and in the Great Creator."

The fourth miner to surface was the Bolivian Carlos Mamani. He knelt down, as soon as he came out of the capsule and pointed to heaven, giving thanks to God.

Omar Reygadas, a 56-year-old electrician did the same. He came out of the capsule with a Bible in his hands and knelt down to give thanks to God.

Written on his helmet was, "God lives."

The president of Chile, Sebastián Piñera, publicly acknowledged the faith of the thirty three miners.

"Faith has moved mountains," he said. "Because it has been the faith of the miners, the strength, the courage, the will of these thirty three miners, and of their family members, of the rescuers, of the Chilean government and of all Chileans that have made possible this miracle."

## *Cross Roads* - Penny Burley

If I am asked to reflect on how has my life has changed since I first attended Burnie Christian Centre and personally accepted Jesus as my Lord and Saviour. I would compare it to an incident that occurred around 20 years ago during a family holiday to Cradle Mountain. Upon arrival we decided to go for a quick walk, we did not sign in as it was only to be a short walk - maybe it wasn't even expected that people sign in back then.

The five adults (all of whom should have known better) two small children and a baby were certainly not appropriately clothed nor prepared for this walk. As we did not heed the sign clearly instructing us to turn left (Melissa would add something here but that is another story) our short walk turned into many hours. We found ourselves trudging through dense bush, across broad plains that seemed to stretch forever and alongside sheer cliff faces.

growth with desperation becoming increasingly evident as the hours passed and the darkness and cold enveloped us. I will never forget the warm, inviting, golden beam of light



shining out of the darkness towards us as we eventually found our way back to the chalet.

I often think of this analogy as I reflect on my life since accepting Jesus Christ as my Lord and Saviour. Jesus is that saving light shining into the darkness of our lives, welcoming us home. God will always walk beside us and watch over us no matter what path we may take, but He gives us freewill to make our own choices and take our own paths. During our lifetimes He shows us many signposts, clearly marked. As a consequence of my choice to ignore the many signposts God placed in my life I spent over half my lifetime being led in wrong directions, going around in circles, stumbling along tracks, getting caught in thickets and pushing my way through undergrowth, as well as dragging others with me. It is difficult to see where you are going when you are walking in darkness.

My life as I then knew it was to change four years ago when thanks to the encouragement of Nicola, Chris and Melissa I attended Burnie Christian Centre. Despite the con-

Apart from the children, ALMS also support the Care Givers (parents and guardians) especially women who seen to be proactive. We have also started teaching them Entrepreneurship and Small Business Management with the hope to empower them with small monies for them to boost the businesses, or for them to start small businesses for self sustainability. We also teach them Literacy so that they can know how to reach and write to enable them read the Bible. The work is enormous and we pray that the Lord can convict you to work in partnership with us.

cerns of Peter Lucas that I would find the music too loud I am still here! It was not to be the music that confronted me - it was to be my preconceived ideas and judgemental attitude towards church and life.

But back to the very beginning - I was born in Camperdown, Victoria where my parents had a dairy farm. At two years of age my parents accepted an offer to move to Tasmania and share farm a family property near Deloraine. I grew up in a religious family and attended the small local church each Sunday. As there was no Sunday School I can remember enjoying sitting at the kitchen table completing my Sunday School story booklets and colouring in sheets which arrived in the mail.

At 8 years of age (and having gained three younger brothers) my parents made the decision to purchase a farm near Wynyard. I can vividly remember being afraid on my last day of school at Deloraine Primary. My teacher told me that she would tie me to the door handle by my pig-tails so I could not leave! In those days teachers did as they said!

I arrived at Boat Harbour Primary School feeling very overwhelmed, as I felt I had moved far from everything familiar and was surrounded by a classroom full of students who actually were all related (I do understand Julie Anne!). I later attended Wynyard High School and then Burnie High School for Years 11 and 12.

Despite friendships, doing well at school and being involved in school activities I do remember that I felt like I never quite fitted in and felt a

strong need to be accepted and included by my peers, a factor to influence many decisions.

During this time I attended St Stephens Anglican Church on a weekly basis, attending Sunday school and joining in church activities. As with most people of my age I grew up clearly knowing which church denomination I belonged to.

The choices I made after Year 12 were to affect my life for a long period. Despite much opposition I decided not to continue with my education, married at a young age and moved to Sydney. After several years I returned to Wynyard where Melissa and Paul were born. I remember the ever constant moves during the 17 years of this marriage, both locally and interstate. My pride determined that I would make this marriage work at all costs. I covered up much; very early on losing sight of the person God meant me to be.

to be. Upon reflection, each day I put on **my own armour** to fight **my** way through everything that is associated with an extremely difficult and harsh marriage.

Little did I realise that when we choose not to walk in the ways God has prepared for us we actually lose sight of where we are meant to be and collect an incredible amount of baggage. I was surrounded by it and didn't even realise. In fact I am

amazed how I even managed to carry it all. I guess I didn't, a lot fell on those around me. The eventual break down of my marriage further added to my baggage and left me determined to prove at whatever cost that I could cope and raise two children alone. As I reflect on this period in my life I know that God watched over me during those difficult years, provided many signposts and options, but always let me choose to walk my own path.

Grattan entered our lives seven years later and I thank him for his kind heart and gentle spirit. He has stood quietly beside me as God has worked through the layers of guilt, shame, control, pride and the "Martha behaviours" which were stamped all over and through me. With many tears the long line of baggage I saw attached to me each time I sat in church has now gone.

I used to wonder how anyone else could ever fit in the church as these individual boxes tied to a long line of string extended from my seat right down the stairs! Each of these boxes is a story in itself.

Not long after coming to the Burnie Christian Centre I felt God calling me to study Social Work. I argued against this for quite some time then knew I had to walk out onto the branch and let go. What God has done for me over these years and how He has used this course to teach and grow me is truly amazing.

I am blessed as I walk the path He has asked me to walk. I have stopped and listened to Him and kept myself surrounded by Christians who can advise and help me when I face fears and the many obstacles that are thrown in my path. I do not know where this course will lead but I do know I will have more challenges (not struggles - thanks Grattan!) to face. For me, God places stones in front to lead me, little by little, as I discover His call for my life.

He has opened the door for my Uni placement in Community Development at the Wynyard Council knowing I plan to visit Cambodia with a mission team in January. He has asked me to walk, and He has walked beside me, through many workplace challenges and dark spiritual battles which I often don't understand and which have left me utterly and totally overwhelmed. But I have learnt that as I keep walking along the path He has chosen for me, He walks beside me. He has the victory if I keep my eyes focussed on Him.

Through my story I hope that I can help others to follow the signposts God has for our lives. Our lives are far too precious to Him to be wasted, thrown away and trampled upon. He has great things for all of us if we listen to His voice and follow His
